







The Spanish-Jewish Primary School for Boys
It was previously known simply as the Talmud Torah, which is what the sign over the door says. By 1904, this and the girls' school were prestigious private elementary schools whose students attended free of charge, thanks to funding from the Halfon family foundation.



The Ciocanul (Hammer) School, the first Jewish vocational school in Romania, located on Calea Dudești was founded in 1897 at the initiative of the industrialist Adolf Salomon. It quickly became one of the most prestigious vocational education institutions in the country, its diplomas being recognized internationally.






